Welcome to Spring!

According to the United States Census Bureau, in 2022, there were 10.9 million one-parent families with children under the age of 18. Data also showed that 80% of one-parent families were maintained by the mother.

But it's not why I bring this up. A while back I watched a film called "Creed", which came out in 2015 and starred Michael B. Jordan as Adonis Creed and Sylvester Stallone as Rocky Balboa, the "Italian Stallion".

In short, the film followed the early boxing career of young Adonis Johnson Creed, son of the late Apollo Creed, and Rocky's one time rival and friend. The film begins with us seeing an adolescent Creed in a physical altercation with another young man, both housed in juvenile detention. He is an angry and troubled young man being raised by a single mother.

(As a side note, Adonis Johnson Creed is the son of an affair between a married Apollo Creed and Adonis' mother who is only ever referred to as Ms. Johnson).

Creed, we are told, grows up fully aware of who his father was. And with that knowledge the natural feelings of rejection, abandonment, and a lack of self-worth dog his heels well into adulthood. These 'prevalent' feelings are what many, many children of single parent households experience.

The scene that stuck with me the most, features a proboxing match that is the culmination of the film and *Creed's*

journey. In that scene, Creed is getting clobbered. One eye is completely swollen shut and blood is pouring down his face. He has already been out cold once, but managed to stagger to his feet before the ref could reach the 10 count and call it.

It's at this point while he's catching his breath in his corner sucking down liquid and getting his injuries temporarily 'scotch-taped' up, that his coach Rocky says he wants to 'throw the towel 'which in boxing means to stop the fight and accept defeat. Typically, this is done by the coach from the sidelines when their boxer is struggling.

Well Adonis is having none of it. He says emphatically no way, he "has to finish" (the fight). "I've got to prove it." And Rocky wants to understand what? "Prove what?"

And Creed says, "That I'm not a mistake.".

And that's the fundamental idea that really hits home. A lot of homes. The mistaken belief that unintended means unwanted. Unexpected means mistaken. It's a powerful line and one that is heartbreaking in its simplicity and constant presence in the minds and hearts of so many children from broken homes,

## A New Program

Speaking of new programs – Next Step is just a month or so away from offering our latest medical services for the community. Free of charge. We have partnered with the Center for Disease Detection (CDD) in San Antonio, Texas to offer testing for several sexually-transmitted diseases.



In Snohomish County alone the rate of transmission has increased dramatically. People ages 15-24 who tested positive for Gonorrhea ballooned from 180 cases in 2016 to 254 cases in 2020. And in 2016 there were 1,411 positive cases of Chlamydia, in the 15-24-year-old age range. This rose to 1,501 cases in 2020. And the reality is that in 2023, the numbers look like they will be even higher! We hope by offering these tests we can plant some seeds.

Seeds of self-worth, respect for each other and ourselves, cleanliness of mind, body, and spirit, and seeing ourselves as He sees us. As beautiful sons and daughters of the King!

**repave the parking lot** and ensure we're looking clean, professional, and welcoming inside and out! Hoping for completion by May!


## **ACCREDITATION NEWS!!**
